DETAILED EXPERIENCE:

Mr. Greenwood has extensive experience in radioactive waste disposal projects, including providing support to the U.S. Department of Energy in the area of TRU waste management. Mr. Greenwood provided support to the Central Characterization Project (CCP) and to the National TRU Program Office (NTP) of the DOE Carlsbad Field Office (CBFO). In this capacity Mr. Greenwood was responsible for the development of the procedures used by the CCP mobile characterization efforts. These procedures have been audited and approved by the responsible regulatory agencies at three generator sites.

Mr. Greenwood also provided support to the CBFO Strategic Planning Initiative to accelerate the removal and clean-up of TRU waste from DOE facilities across the nation. Mr. Greenwood was responsible for the management on all Acceptable Knowledge development for the CCP. In addition, he was responsible for the collection and dissemination of inventory data from the TRU complex. This data was used to support the performance assessment of the WIPP repository.

Mr. Greenwood provided support to the CBFO NTP in the review of all permit modifications which affect the waste analysis plan. He also provided review of generator site procedures to ensure effective implementation of both EPA and New Mexico Environmental Department requirements.

Mr. Greenwood also provided direct support to the management of the CCP in resolution of issues arising from the mobilization and ongoing activities of the mobile characterization units.

Mr. Greenwood also served as the Manager of Environmental Programs for the Carlsbad Office of the Department of Energy. During this time he was responsible for all interfaces with the regulators, both EPA and the New Mexico Environmental Department, with regard to all permitting issues arising from the operation of the Waste Isolation Pilot Plant (WIPP) site. He also was responsible for the development of the hazardous waste permit for the bin scale program, a forerunner to the current WIPP facility permit.
